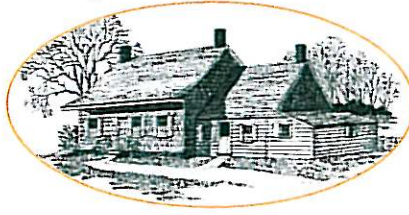


Summer Camp/Youth Trip Permission Slip



Welcome to the Wyckoff Farmhouse Museum. The Wyckoff Farmhouse Museum is the oldest structure in New York City, with rooms dating back to 1652. We interpret the agricultural history and diverse people of Brooklyn during colonial times, and as part of Kings County from the 1800s through the 1940s.

Your child will be visiting our museum on \_\_\_\_\_ with his or her summer youth group/camp. They will explore two of our period rooms, the old kitchen from 1652 and common parlor circa 1742, and participate in the following hands-on activities:



**Butter Churning:** Using a butter churn and heavy cream, students will make butter, and then taste it on slices of wheat bread.



**Berry Ink with Quill Pen:** Students will assist the educator to make ink using either blackberries or raspberries, vinegar and salt. After, they will test out the ink using a quill pen.



**Herbal Sachets:** Using strips of ribbon and cloth, students choose one – two herbs (peppermint, chamomile, sage, lavender, or eucalyptus) to make an herbal sachet colonials would have placed into their sleeping pallets (mattress).

Please let your teacher know if your child has any allergies to our ingredients. Also, from time to time, we photograph our school groups and use the images for our publications, press, etc. In addition to the permission slip, we ask that you complete the photographic permission as well. Thank you.
